

GAIL mcap hits ₹1-trillion mark

Mumbai, 22 December

Shares of the state-owned gas transmission company GAIL (India) scaled a fresh peak as the company's market capitalisation (mcap) crossed the ₹1 trillion mark in intraday trade, according to BSE data on Friday. At close, its mcap was ₹99,580 crore.

The stock surged 8.8 per cent to hit a one-year high of 151.20, surpassing the previous high of 149.20 on December 15, before closing at 151.45, a gain of 7.64 per cent over Thursday's close.

GAIL's activities range from natural gas transmission and distribution to processing (for fractionating LPG, propane, special boiling point [SBP] solvent, and pentane), transmission of LPG.

The firm is also engaged in the production and marketing of petrochemicals like high-density polyethylene (HDPE) and linear low-density polyethylene (LLDPE) and leasing bandwidth in telecommunications.

Being the owner of the largest natural gas pipeline infrastructure in India, GAIL has leveraged its position to extend its presence in power, LNG regasification, city gas distribution (CGD), and

exploration and production (E&P) through various equity and joint venture (JV) participation.

India is planning a network of LNG fueling stations along its 6,000-km-long golden quadrilateral highways, a move that would encourage thousands of truckers to switch to cleaner fuel from polluting diesel.

GAIL is running a pilot project with Coal India, for retrofitting LNG kits in dumpers, putting together a plan and persuading all possible participants to help build an effective ecosystem for LNG-fueled vehicles in the country.

Analysts at ICICI Securities have a 'buy' rating on GAIL with a 12-month target price of ₹188 per share.

The stock finally managed to surpass its 2018 highs last month and made record highs on the back of significant delivery-based buying.

"From the F&O front, the stock is already witnessing a closure of open interest, which has started declining after making highs near 18 crore shares. We expect it to remain in an uptrend with continued closure in the futures segment," ICICI Securities said in a note.

गेल (इंडिया) का शेयर शुक्रवार को नई ऊंचाई पर पहुंच गया और इस तरह से कंपनी एक लाख करोड़ रुपये के बाजार पूंजीकरण वाले क्लब में शामिल हो गई। सरकारी स्वामित्व वाली गैस पारेषण कंपनी का शेयर शुक्रवार को कारोबारी सत्र के दौरान 8 फीसदी उछल गया।

कंपनी का शेयर 15 दिसंबर के पिछले उच्चस्तर 149.20 रुपये के पार निकल गया। इसका औसत ट्रेडिंग वॉल्यूम आज चार गुना उछल गया। एनएसई व बीएसई पर दिन में 1.35 बजे तक 6.39 करोड़ शेयरों का कारोबार हुआ।

बीएसई के आंकड़ों के मुताबिक, अभी गेल का बाजार पूंजीकरण एक लाख करोड़ रुपये हैं। कैलेंडर वर्ष 2023 में अब तक इस शेयर में 59 फीसदी की बढ़ोतरी हुई है जबिक एसऐंडपी बीएसई सेंसेक्स 16 फीसदी चढ़ा है।

TOI Traces IGL's Success Story In Providing Cleaner Fuel For Vehicles & Piped Gas For Homes, But Some Challenges Remain

New Delhi: When the world Delhi government had ahead of it a mountain of challenges. To quell the regular skirmishes among exasperated drivers, the then Union petroleum minister Ram Naik and chief minister Sheila Dikshit both made the rounds of CNG filling stations and directed IGL to improve its functioning. "We imported compressors from Argentina to enhance the dispensing facilities," said Kumar. Over its 25-year journey, the company not only facilitated the transition of public transportation to the more environmentally friendly fuel, but also revolutionised kitchens by providing piped gas to households in most parts of the city. It combated sceptire were frequent complaints cism surrounding the safety of natural gas by running campaigns to assure the public that CNG and PNG were secure.

Initially, the switch to the cleaner fuel meant installing government-approved, imported kits in cars. The lower cost and superior fuel economy of CNG relative to petrol and diesel made the gas popular among the middle class. Maruti introduced five models of CNG cars in 2010, a number that has grown to over 100 models of various automobile manufacturers. Kumar stated that 15.000-17.000 new CNG cars are added to the system every rates. Remarkably every fourth vehicle - private and commercial combined - registered in Delhi now runs on CNG.

the construction stage.

More than 16 lakh households in the capital now have PNG connections, while the number exceeds 25 lakh if commercial establishments and industries are considered.

IGL managing director Kamal Kishore Chatiwal admitted that despite the lowered waiting time at filling stations, the queues remain an issue. "We know we need to augment our compression and dispensation capacity to address this issue. Our goal is to achieve a queue less operation," Chatiwal asserted. "To this purpose, we are establishing new filling stations, adding more dispensers and leveraging technology to reduce queues. Unlike earlier when IGL operated dispensing facilities at certain petro pumps, we are now appointing dealers to run CNG stations known as dealer-owned-dealeroperated outlets. The dealers possess the land, obtain the mandatory approvals and we set up the machinery and dispensers." IGL will invite appli cations to set up 170-180 such stations in Delhi and NCR towns.

At several filling stations, IGL has relocated compressors, which consume substantial space, to the first floor of office buildings, maximising the free area by installing more dispensers.

The company is also colla borating with a technology provider, which has mapped all filling stations on an appli cation, obtaining real-time CCTV feeds and data on private cars taxis autos and buses This data is used to determine approximate waiting times at each location. "Through IGL's Connect app, a CNG user can view waiting times at all sta tions within a 5km radius and choose the one with the least crowding," Kumar said.

IGL officials said their current focus was on extending services to villages and pockets in the Walled City. The company recently inaugurated its first PNG facility in Qutabgarh village. "Laying pipelines in narrow lanes, despite requests, remains a challenge," said Kumar.

IGL has now diversified into electric mobility and established around 40 e-charging stations
